## Local teens stand against dating violence

Local youth took a stand against teen dating violence, Friday, Feb. 27, during February's National teen Dating Violence awareness Month. Statistics show that one in five teenage girls will be physically and/or sexually abused by a dating partner before they graduate from high school.

Members of The Shelter's Youth Advisory Council hosted an informational booth at Immokalee Zocalo, on the corner of Main Street and North First Street. During the two hour event, the six-member group held up signs and distributed information to more than 85 people. The event was part of several awareness raising activities held in Immokalee during the month of February.

"Our goal is to break the cycle of abuse by raising awareness on teen dating abuse," said Immokalee Outreach Office Manager Josie Means. "We are encouraging everyone – especially parents and teens – to start talking about what it means to have a healthy relationship."

On Feb. 10 advocates at The Shelter's Im-

mokalee Outreach Office commemorated Orange4love by wearing orange to promote Teen Dating Violence Awareness. They also presented 40 outreach classes to more than 1,600 youth at Collier County Public Schools.

The Shelter, Collier County's only certified domestic violence center, is leading the community to prevent, protect and prevail over domestic violence through advocacy, empowerment and social change. Since 1989, the nonprofit organization has served more than 68,000 children, women, men and their pets. ## Health insurance enrollment at Planned Parenthood

NAPLES, Fla. (March 10, 2015) – The enrollment period for health insurance through the Affordable Care Act will reopen March 15 through April 30.

Planned Parenthood of Collier County has employees and volunteers who are certified and ready to assist consumers with their applications.

Appointments are available April 2, 16 and 30 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Planned Parenthood office in Naples.

Those making appointments should plan to spend an hour with a certified application counselor and bring proof of income, such as a pay stub or tax statement.

There are five plan categories under the Affordable Care Act: bronze, silver, gold, platinum and catastrophic. They differ by how much the plan pays for medical costs, the responsibilities assumed by consumers and the cost of monthly premiums.

For instance, bronze plans, which have the lowest premiums, pay 60 percent of medical costs, while platinum plans pay 90 percent.

According to the state's insurance office, about 90 percent of Floridians who enrolled for coverage in 2014 had incomes that qualified them for premium subsidies.
