

Programs & Services

All services are free of charge.

Confidential 24-Hour Crisis Line (239) 775-1101

Trained advocates provide counseling, safety planning, and referrals 365 days a year. Call 911 for immediate danger.

Emergency Shelter (239) 775-1101

Adult and child victims of domestic violence, including their pets, can find safety and support at The Shelter's secure, 60-bed safe haven. A family service management model is used.

Advocacy and Counseling

Through offices in Naples, Immokalee, and Bonita Springs, certified domestic violence advocates address the unique DV issues facing children, teens, and adults.

Court and Legal Advocacy

Bilingual advocates assist program participants with injunctions for protection and offer support for civil, criminal, and immigration processes.

Support Groups

A variety of closed support groups are offered in English and Spanish, for women, children, and teens. Groups are held in Naples, Immokalee, and Bonita Springs.

Direct Assistance

The Shelter is able to assist both residential and outreach program participants meet their basic needs, such as food, clothing, personal care items, furniture, cell phones for emergencies, transportation, and other necessities.

Healing Arts Program

Through individual and group counseling, this program utilizes meditation, yoga, creative writing, and artwork to move participants toward healing and building inner strength and self-esteem.

Elder Abuse Response

This program helps elder abuse survivors find the freedom they so deserve in their golden years and reclaim their independence.

Women of Means

The Women of Means program supports self-identified affluent women who have specialized needs based on the power, privilege, and access to resources by their batterer.

Transitional Housing

Featuring four transitional housing cottages, this program is designed to help survivors develop assets, achieve their personal goals, and increase their standard of living. It includes a component on economic empowerment.

Community Education

Presentations, training, and media interviews are provided to the community by professional staff. Domestic violence CEU's are available to professionals required to maintain licensure.

Primary Prevention

Programs, activities, and support promote social change and prevent domestic violence before it starts.

Thrift Shoppe

Options Thrift Shoppe accepts community donations of new and gently used clothing, furniture, and accessories for resale to the public and for our program participants starting new lives.
